LTC Richard A. Riis Jr. United States Army he served for 41 years first in the regular Army during WWII while serving with the 104th Infantry Division (Timber Wolf Division) in Europe. He fought in two of the fiercest battles in Europe, the battle of the Hurtgen Forest and the one everyone is familiar with the Battle of the Bulge. As a Platoon Leader he was awarded the Combat Infantry Mans Badge, Silver Star for Gallantry in action, the Bronze Star with a "V" device and a four oak leaf clusters and the Purple Heart.

After the war he transferred to the Army reserve and finally to the California National Guard where he retired as Lt. Colonel and Battalion Commander of the 140th 1st

Combat Engineers. He continued his education and graduated from the New York State University at Ithaca under the GI Bill. He also was a local teacher and administrator for many years and participated in many local projects. God Bless Richard may he rest in Peace.

Misenhimer United States Army James was born in San Diego and raised in La Quinta, Calif. while in High School lames became involved in the ROTC and was instrumental in starting a La Crosse team along with his brother Brian. It is a 20-bedroom house that is warm and inviting. It has no sharp angles, rather rounded corners, even rounded edges on the fireplace mantel. It has soft, soothing colors, and lots of sound ins



ulation to provide a quiet place in which families might relax, reflect and be rejuvenated. Since it opened in November 1989, it has adjusted to a changing ratio in care for children from almost all cancer-related stays to about an even split between families with children who need cancer treatments and those that need neonatal care, which together account for about 70% of those who stay at the House. 
