Dear Legion Family Members and Friends,

The American Legion has been the nation's foremost authority on the U.S. flag since the Americanism Commission convened the first National Flag Conference in 1923. That's when the U.S. Flag Code was crafted and adopted by dozens of organizations in attendance, from schoolteachers to U.S. Navy sailors.

Thanks to the efforts of The American Legion and other leaders in flag respect, pieces of the Stars and Stripes are no longer cut out and given to friends or family as mementoes. Likewise, it was the flag conference that made unacceptable the practice of putting one's signature on a U.S. flag.

Now, in a special centennial bookazine, The American Legion Family is sharing the story of Old Glory and the organization's role in its respect, love and reverence. "Indivisible: The Story of Our Flag" – is a beautifully illustrated, 112-page collector's edition all about our nation's colors. The bookazine is durable like a book, but the design is similar to a magazine – color photographs and illustrations appear throughout it. The bookazine contains interesting historical tidbits, voices, fun facts and more information about the flag from the Revolutionary War to the 21st century.

Right now in this country of ours we are losing a veteran to suicide every two hours. With more charitable donations with events, we can make a difference. Thank you to all that have stepped up to help.

Many of our riders attended the 2015 **Injured Warrior Appreciation Run** November 6. 2015. This year the ride itself was not able to have the event at the Hospital in Camp Pendleton because of the heightened security awareness. The ride this year was rerouted to the Planes of Fame Museum in Chino, CA. According to press reports, there were around 1,000 motorcycles in the escorted ride and about \$100,000 was raised for the Injured Warriors. Many of the warriors from the hospital in Camp Pendleton were driven from the hospital

and able to attend the ceremonies.




