

LEGION FACTS: DID YOU KNOW?

POW/MIA CHAIR

Resolution 288, adopted at the Legion's 67th National Convention, calls for designating an empty chair at all official American Legion meetings as a continual physical symbol of POW/MIAs and the cause for which we

stand, namely their return or full accounting.

At any official meeting, the POW/MIA chair takes its place at the front of the podium, on a platform, facing the membership. Standard procedure at the beginning of the meeting is the Post Commander asks the First and 2nd Vice (or designated persons) to approach the empty POW/MIA chair carrying the POW/MIA flag (chair cover), and place the POW/MIA flag upon the empty chair. At the end of the meeting, the flag is recovered.

POW/MIA CHAIR: DO YOU SALUTE THE CHAIR?

When placing and removing the flag on the empty POW/MIA chair, do the designated individuals salute the flag? Argument: Yes, you salute the POW/ MIA chair to show respect to all fallen.

prisoner of war, and missing in action service members.

Counter Argument: No, because the service member is not dead, they are still missing. You salute the American flag.

Conclusion: Similar to the Sacred Ground, it is the Post's discretion to honor and salute as each Post sees fit. At Post 555, designated individuals placing the flag will salute the American Flag.

POW/MIA TABLE: PLACE SETTING FOR ONE

The POW/MIA table is also known as The Missing Man Table, and the Fallen Comrade Table. It is a place of honor in memory of the fallen, missing in action, and prisoner of war service members.

Each item of the place setting is sym-

The small table is set for one, representing the frailty of one prisoner, alone against his or her suppressors.

The table is usually set close to, or within sight of, the entrance to the dining room.

The table is round showing our everlasting concern for our POW/MIA's.

The cloth is white symbolizing the purity of their intentions to respond to their country's call to arms.

The single red rose signifying the blood they may have shed in sacrifice to ensure the freedom of our beloved United States of American. This rose, reminding us of the family and friends of our missing comrades who keep the faith, while awaiting their return.

The yellow ribbon stands for the yellow ribbons worn on the lapels of the thousands who demand with unyielding determination a proper accounting of our comrades who are not among us tonight.

A slice of lemon reminding us of the bitter fate of those missing, captured and held as prisoners in foreign lands. A pinch of salt denoting the tears of our missing and their families who long for answers after decades of uncertainty. The Holy Bible represents the strength gained through faith in our country, founded as one nation under Go, to sustain those lost from our midst. The lighted candle reflects the light of hope which lives in our hearts to illuminate their way home, away from their

captors, to the open arms of a grateful nation.

The glass is inverted symbolizing their inability to share this evening's toast.


SACRED GROUND

While official American Legion, Auxiliary, Squadron, and Legion Riders meetings are in session, the ground in front of the POW/MIA chair is considered Sacred Ground, which means that no persons shall walk in this area while the meeting is in session, except placement and removal of the POW/MIA flag.

There is no hard rule on the precise boundary of Sacred Ground, which means that it is open for each Legion Post to honor the Sacred Ground as each Post sees fit. At Post 555, the sacred ground is the area bordered by the tables at which the membership and officers are seated.




