Presenting this month's 'Did You Know' article:

District 29 Commander, ALR Chapter 555 Historian, Post 555 Legionnaire, and candidate for First Vice Commander: Ken George.

After recently transferring to your post, the commander asked me to write an article on some random trivial Legion facts. After teaching a few courses for the first inaugural Department of California Legion College, I had a few ideas so I decided to make everyone aware of online training at the Legion.org website.



I would like to inform everyone that the national American Legion organization has updated an online course that used to be called *American Legion Extension Institute* (ALEI). The course which is offered online and in the class-room, teaches our members about The American Legion as a whole starting with the history, the four pillars, Legion family programs (SONS and Riders) and the 26 programs under the four pillars. Recently, National has updated and revamped the course calling it *Basic Training*. The course is still offered online and it is free to all Legion family members.

The course is designed to go at your own pace where you can even login and logout with the ability to pick up where you left off. Depending on your pace, the course could take as little as an hour and a half. At the end of each segment, there is a test to see how much you retained. There is also the ability to test your knowledge

right up front where you can take the final exam first. I took the final test first myself and passed. However, if you do not pass the final without taking the course, that is even more of a reason to take the course. I promise you, taking the course is fun and informative. It even has videos for those who hate to read.

Anyone interested in taking the course, can go to www.legion.org/training or www.legion.org/alei. At the end of the course, if you would like to purchase a graduate pin for your cap or lapel, you can order it for \$4.95 plus shipping. You will need your mylegion.org account information to login. If you do not have it, don't panic. Setting up an account is easy. If you are having any difficulty setting



up your mylegion.org account, please feel free to contact me at kalangeorge@gmail.com. I will be more than happy to assist you.

Lastly, anyone who takes the course and produces their graduate certificate, I will offer a one-time only free drink at the bar. Happy learning and remember, a trained Legionnaire is a knowledgeable Legionnaire. We need more trained and knowledgeable legionnaires.







POST 555 ELECTIVE AND APPOINTED POSITIONS

Summary of Albert E. Schwab Post 555 organization duties and responsibilities for elective and appointed positions:

ELECTIVE OFFICERS

COMMANDER - The Post Commander shall preside at all meetings of the Post and has general supervision over the business affairs of the Post. Such officer shall be the Chief **Executive Officer of the Post** and shall perform such other duties as directed by the Post. The Commander shall approve all orders directing the disbursement of funds and shall make an annual report covering the business of the Post for the year and make recommendations for the ensuing year.

FIRST VICE-COMMANDER — He/She shall assume and discharge the duties of the office of Commander in the absence or disability of, or when called upon by the Post Commander. The First-Vice Commander shall be the Post's Membership Chairperson.

SECOND VICE-COMMANDER
- The 2nd Vice Commander
shall assume and discharge the
duties of the office of First ViceCommander in the absence of
or disability of such officer, and
shall perform such other duties
as directed by the Post Com-

mander. He/She will be concerned with the work of the Veterans' Affairs and Rehabilitation programs, and provide programs to spice up the meetings and attract attendance.

EXECUTIVE-BOARD – The Board of Directors (The E-Board) shall consist of the elective officers of the post, the Junior Past Commander, and three elected members. The executive committee shall consider all matters pertaining to the Post and shall make recommendations to the Post.

APPOINTED OFFICERS:

ADJUTANT – The Adjutant shall have charge of and keep a full and corrected record of all records as the Department and National Organizations may require, render reports on membership annually or when called upon at a meeting, and under direction of the commander, handle all correspondence received by the Department or National Organization. He/She shall also supervise the annual nomination and lection process.

FINANCE OFFICER - The Finance Officer: The Finance Officer of the Post shall have charge of all finances and see that they are safely deposited in a local bank or banks and shall

report once a month to the Executive Committee the condition of the finances of the Post. with such recommendations as may deem expedient or necessary for raising funds with which to carry on the activities of the Post. He/She or two (2) members of the Executive Board shall sign all checks disbursing the monies of the Post. The Finance Officer shall be bonded under a blanket bond procured from the Department Headquarters and paid for by the Post at cost.

HISTORIAN - The Historian shall be charged with the individual records and incidents of the Post and Post members. and shall perform such other duties as directed by the Post or Executive Board. The Post Historian is also charged with photographing and documenting Post events. Sergeant-at-Arms: The Sergeant-at-Arms shall preserve order at all meetings and shall perform such other duties as may be from time to time assigned to him/her by the Commander or Executive Board.

SERGANT-AT-ARMS - The Sergeant-at-Arms shall preserve order at all meetings and shall perform such other duties as may be from time to time assigned to him/her by the Post Commander. CHAPLAIN - The Chaplain shall be charged with the spiritual welfare of the Post members and will offer divine but nonsectarian service in the event of dedications, funerals, public functions, and adhere to such ceremonial rituals as are recommended by the National or Department Headquarters.

JUDGE ADVOCATE - It shall be the duties of the Judge Advocate shall be to supply professional advice in the conduct of Post business or render council. He/she is to interpret the American Legion Constitution and By-Laws and may be called upon by the Commander and/ or other officers of the Post to rule on the legality of their actions and make decisions insofar as they affect the good of the American Legion. The Judge Advocate shall be in charge of the auditing of all the post accounts and ledgers.

SERVICE OFFICER - The Service Officer shall be generally that of prosecuting claims and protecting the rights and privileges of all veterans, their dependents and survivors and to handle such other matters as may properly be considered service work.

"In Flanders Fields" is a war poem in the form of a rondeau, written during the First World War by Canadian physician and Lt. Col. John McCrae. He was inspired to write it on May 3, 1915, after presiding over the funeral of friend and fellow soldier Alexis Helmer, who died during the Second Battle of Ypres.


In Flanders fields the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row That mark our place; and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce heard amid the guns below

The poppy was adopted as the as the American Legion Family's memorial flower in the 1920's. 
